Precinct Election Official Guide

Precinct Election Officials

Every election the Cleveland County Board of Elections needs people to work election voting polls on Election Day. These are the people who ask the voters to state their name, address and operate the Voting Machines that help the voters cast their vote.

Each precinct (voting poll) is staffed with a Chief Judge, two Party Judges, two Paper Work Assistants and a number of other assistants. The Chief Judge is of the same political party as the Governor of North Carolina. The two Judges are from different political parties, and the assistants are equally selected from the two political parties, whenever possible. The Precinct Judges are responsible for conducting the election. There are a total of five (5) appointed election officials in each precinct.

Chief Judge

The Chief Judge is the head official and is in charge of contacting the voting location and the other officials to make arrangements for each election. The Chief Judge is responsible for handling Election Day activities, assigning duties, and solving problems. This individual is also responsible for picking up Election Day supplies prior to each election and returning supplies after the polls close. The Chief Judge is also responsible for the Canvass of Election results and the resulting certification of Election results from their precinct. The Chief Judge must study and be knowledgeable of all election laws, procedures and materials. Mandatory instructional training will be provided for each election. Chief Judge has a two year appointment from August to August of odd-numbered years.

Judges

The Judges work closely with the Chief Judge. They must study and be knowledgeable of all election laws, procedures and materials. All Precinct Judges must sign all official documents and serve on a panel to solve any challenges. One judge is responsible for conducting the election in the Chief Judge's absence. Precinct Judges must also be accountable for the certification of Election results from their precinct. Mandatory instructional training will be provided for each election. Judges have a two year appointment from August to August of odd-numbered years.

Paper Work Assistants

The Paper Work Assistant is responsible for assisting voters on Election Day with any registration problems. This includes Precinct Transfers, Provisional Ballots, address and name changes and other Election Day problems. This position will involve the completion of much paper work on Election Day. Mandatory instructional training will be provided for each election. Paper Work Assistants have a two year appointment from August to August of odd-numbered years.

Assistants

The Assistants serve when needed and at the direction of the Chief Judge. They

will serve as greeters, machine attendants, etc.. They may be required to attend instructional training for each election.

RESPONSIBILITIES

A. Qualifications

- Registered voter in Cleveland County and resident of precinct appointment (may be non-resident temporary appointment)
- Able to read and write
- Of good repute
- Computer literate
- Conduct themselves in a professional, politically impartial, and friendly manner
- Be sensitive to voters with special needs
- Not an elective office-holder, candidate for nomination or election, holds an office in state, congressional district, county or precinct political party or organization, or a manager or treasurer for any candidate or political party
- Not a spouse, father, mother, son, daughter, brother, or sister of any candidate for nomination or election (G.S. 163-41-1)
- Can not serve simultaneously with spouse, child, spouse of a child, or sibling (G.S. 163-41-1)

B. Commitment

- To be at all Primary, General, and Special elections during the term of appointment
- To be a part of mandatory training sessions for all elections during the term of appointment as prescribed by law (G.S. 163-46., 163-82.24)
- Take an Oath of Office
- Inform CCBOE if:
 1. A relative (wife, husband, mother, father, daughter, son, sister or brother) will be a candidate during an election in which you are scheduled to serve. (G.S. 163-41.1)
 2. A relative is to serve as a precinct official in the same precinct as you are serving. Serving in the same precinct as a **near relative** is prohibited by G.S. 163-41.1 (**Near relatives: Parent, sister, brother, child, spouse, daughter-in-law, son-in-law, mother-in-law, father-in-law, grandparent, grandchild, stepchild, stepparent, and legal guardian**)
 3. Unable to serve on Election Day

Special Information:

- Elections are currently held on Tuesdays
- Polls open from 6:30 a.m. until 7:30 p.m.
- All workers must be at their voting location at least by 6:00 a.m. and must remain there until all votes have been counted and documents signed, unless other duties have been assigned to particular individuals
- Smoking is not allowed in the polling place
- Personal cell phone use is limited to non-voting areas of the polling place, and then, only on an emergency basis
- No campaign or political buttons, jewelry, or other material can be worn by precinct officials

- Discussion of politics of any kind is NOT permitted while working as a precinct official during any election day
