#### CALL TO ORDER

#### PUBLIC HEARING

### 2015/2016 COUNTY BUDGET PUBLIC HEARING: Chairman Falls

turned the meeting over to the county manager, Jeff Richardson. Mr.

Richardson highlighted various points about the 2015/2016 budget, such as

no tax rate increases, 15 cent funding for the schools, full 5 cent funding to

fire departments and a balanced budget. The budget was based on priorities

put forth by the Commissioners. Mr. Richardson highlighted county

employees and department directors for their contribution.

Commissioner Hutchins asked if the 15 cents to the school could be explained for citizens. Mr. Richardson called on Brian Epley, Finance Director, who shared that the 15 cent was a pass-through tax that was collected by the county and given to the school system. Prior to the school merger every school system had their own amount but when they

consolidated it was agreed that the tax would be 15 cents.

The public hearing was opened at 6:37 p.m.

- Robert Williams: Mr. Williams stated that the sale of the hospital that resulted in 100 million dollars of tax payer money has not been returned to the citizens of this county. It has been used on pet projects like the Legrand Center, the Shooting Range, and the Earl Scruggs Center. \$750,000 in savings from DSS is not new revenue but merely a shifting of tax responsibility from the county to the state. 20% of citizens of the county are on Medicaid yet no prosecutions were being made for those who are selling foodstamps. Mr. Williams said he opposes the new budget.
- JT Scruggs: Mr. Scruggs said he supported the budget and the Commissioners and the work they are doing.
- Steve Thornburg: Dr. Thornburg is the chair of the economic development commission as well as the president of the community college. He thanked the commissioners for their continued support of the college and for investing in workforce development and economic development efforts.

The public hearing was closed at 6:46 p.m.

# **<u>ACTION:</u>** Commissioner Hawkins made the motion to approve the

budget as presented, seconded by Commissioner Holbrook, and

unanimously approved by the Board.
